At this time, study abroad programs have not been canceled, but those planning to go should continue to monitor safety information for destinations.

# 6. Returnees from countries and regions with Infectious Disease Risk Information level 2 or higher

#### ■ Students planning to return to Japan

If you have a fever of  $37.5 \circ C$  or higher and respiratory symptoms at the time of return to Japan, immediately report to the airport or port quarantine station and follow the instructions.

Even if you do not have the above symptoms, refrain from going out for 14 days after returning to Japan and closely monitor your health. If applicable, please continue to check the class start date and be sure to enter the country at least 14 days in advance.
